3. Minutes of the last meeting 5th February 2024

4. Matters Arising

1. **Smoo Cave and Road.** Car and bus parking is still under negotiation. It was noted that other sites for a carpark (towards the tip) are impractical (HM) Discussion and action to remain ongoing, especially as the season progresses with an increase in bus tours

Action HM to take forward

It was agreed that there needs to be a longer term plan. The attraction of Smoo cave is not going to decrease and neither is the increased levels of visitors, levels of traffic, and the urgent need to protect and address the safety of pedestrians and road users.

Plans for 7 houses at Drumblahr is still going ahead (see point 13 below)

2. Fire Hydrants

HM has spoken to Scottish Water. Water pressure is still low and a decision needs to be made as to who is responsible for the cost of upgrades and when this will be carried out. Item to remain on the Agenda.

3. Defibrillators

We now have 3 with weather-proof boxes. 1 at the golf course, 1 at Balnakeil Craft Village and 1 in Durness village centre. The electrician is hoping to complete the installation this week.

4. Notice board

5. Local Place Plan

Drawing up the plan must be a joint enterprise with the Durness Community Group. The question was raised as to whether the landlord/common grazings should be included in the discussions

BA gave a detailed overview of the housing situation in NW Sutherland and details of the proposed affordable housing development at Drumblahr comprising of 7 three-bedroomed houses to be rented out. The scheme is dependent upon funding being made available by the Scottish Government

RM highlighted the problems of a concentration of motorhomes on the Council carpark at Sango, noting that their close proximity to one another is dangerous, there is a campsite within 100 yards, they are within the 30 mph speed limit and that any money generated does not come back to the community.

Robbie asks what can we do to retains visitors rather than them being in the village for a short amount of time. Suggestions are to upgrade the footpath network using wind-farm money, and to re-invigorate the fishing on the lochs.
